**41:03:04:03. Camping permit fees.** The daily fee for the use of a campground site by one camper unit is as follows:

(1) Custer State Park modern campground fee, \$18.96. Campgrounds included are Game Lodge; Sylvan Lake; Grace Coolidge; Legion Lake; Stockade North; Stockade South; and Blue Bell. During cold weather when restroom and shower facilities are closed, the campground fee is reduced by \$2.00;

(2) Modern campground fee, \$11.38. Campgrounds included are Fort Sisseton, except during the Fort Sisseton Festival (see subdivision (6) of this section); Union Grove; Platte Creek; Swan Creek; Fisher Grove; West Whitlock; Indian Creek; Pease Creek; Okobojo Point; Cow Creek; Buryanek; and West Pollock. During cold weather when restroom and shower facilities are closed, the basic campground fee in subdivision (4) applies;

(3) Custer State Park semimodern campground fee, \$17.06. The campground included is Center Lake. During cold weather when restroom and shower facilities are closed, the campground fee is reduced by \$2.00;

(4) Basic campground fee, \$9.48. Campgrounds included are Burke Lake; Shadehill-Llewellyn Johns Memorial; Bear Butte Lake unit; Lake Hiddenwood; Sand Creek; East Whitlock; Tabor; North Wheeler; Spring Creek; Oakwood primitive area; Lake Carthage; South Shore; Whetstone Bay; South Scalp Creek; White Swan; Walth Bay; and Amsden Dam;

(5) Custer State Park French Creek natural area, \$5.69 for each person;

(6) Use of a campground site at Fort Sisseton during the annual Fort Sisseton Festival, \$16.11. Program participants are exempt from paying the camping fee;

(7) Equestrian campground fee, \$11.38. Campgrounds included are Bear Butte Horse Camp and Sica Hollow Horse Camp. However, at Lewis and Clark Horse Camp,

Newton Hills Horse Camp, Oakwood Lakes Horse Camp, Pease Creek Horse Camp, Pelican Lake Horse Camp, and Union Grove Horse Camp the camping fee is \$13.27;

(8) Camping cabin fee, \$35.07. Campgrounds included are those in all state parks and recreation areas where camping cabins are located. However, at Lewis and Clark Recreation Area, Pierson Ranch Recreation Area, and Chief White Crane Recreation Area the camping cabin fee is \$39.81. At Custer State Park the camping cabin fee is \$44.55;

(9) Nonprofit youth group camping fee, \$0.47 for each person or \$5.71, whichever is greater;

(10) Preferred campground fee, \$13.27. Campgrounds included are Oakwood Lakes; Angostura, including Shep's Canyon; Lake Vermillion; Lewis and Clark, except those campsites designated as prime waterfront campsites; Newton Hills; Snake Creek; Palisades; Roy Lake; Lake Herman; Lake Poinsett; Walker's Point; Pickerel; Shadehill-Ketterlings Point; Sandy Shore; Lake Cochrane; Farm Island; Lake Louise; Lake Thompson; Mina; Chief White Crane, except those campsites designated as prime waterfront campsites; Pierson Ranch; North Point; Oahe Downstream; Big Sioux; Hartford Beach; Richmond; Springfield; Rocky Point; West Bend; Randall Creek; and South Pelican. During cold weather when restroom and shower facilities are closed, the modern campground fee in subdivision (2) applies;

(11) Prime campsite fee, \$15.17. Sites included are: all campsites furnished with sewer, water, and electrical service; Lewis and Clark campsite numbers 117P to 161P, inclusive; 163P; 164P; 166P; 213P to 223P, inclusive; 317P to 334P, inclusive; and 384P to 409P, inclusive; and Chief White Crane campsite numbers 111P to 145P, inclusive. During cold weather when restroom and shower facilities are closed, the preferred campground fee in subdivision (10) applies;

(12) Primitive lodging campsite fee, \$20.85. The campground included is Fort Sisseton State Park;

(13) Custer State Park group camping area fee, \$5.69 a person for overnight use with a minimum fee of \$113.74;

(14) The group lodging fee at: Mina Lake State Recreation Area is \$160 and Shadehill State Recreation Area is \$185 a night for the first 8 persons age 12 and over plus \$17 for each additional person age 12 and older; Lake Thompson State Recreation Area, Palisades State Park, Sheps Canyon State Recreation Area, and Newton Hills State Park is \$240 a night for the first 12 persons age 12 and over plus \$17 for each additional person age 12 and older;

(15) Custer State Park, French Creek Horse Camp fee, \$21.80;

(16) Oahe Downstream Group Lodge use fee is \$37.92 per night for nonprofit youth groups year-round and for nonprofit groups and government agencies from November 1 to March 31, inclusive, and \$118.49 per night for all other groups year-round. The use fee for all groups except nonprofit youth groups is \$118.49 from April 1 to October 31, inclusive.

An additional charge of \$3.79 a unit is made for campground sites with electricity.

A South Dakota resident entitled to purchase a camping permit and campsite electrical service for one-half price pursuant to SDCL 41-17-13.4 shall submit written verification of that status from the United States Veterans Administration to the licensing office of the department in Pierre. The licensing office shall send the resident a billfold-size card to use as proof of eligibility for half-price camping fees.

(4) Unit BHE-H2A: those portions of Lawrence, Pennington, and Custer Counties beginning at the junction of the South Dakota-Wyoming border and U.S. Highway 85, then northerly and easterly along U.S. Highway 85 to its junction with U.S. Highway 385, then southerly along U.S. Highway 385 to its junction with U.S. Highway 16 at Custer, then westerly along U.S. Highway 16 to its junction with the South Dakota-Wyoming border, then northerly along the South Dakota-Wyoming border to its junction with U.S. Highway 85, the point of beginning. Unit BHE-H2A is open beginning on October 1 and remains open to October 31, inclusive. In Unit BHE-H2A ~~200~~ 250 "any elk" licenses may be issued;

(9) Unit BHE-H3A: those portions of Custer and Fall River Counties within a line beginning at the junction of the South Dakota-Wyoming state line and U.S. Highway 16, then east along U.S. Highway 16 to the Custer State Park western boundary, then south along the Custer State Park western boundary and the Wind Cave National Park western boundary to U.S. Highway 385, then south along U.S. Highway 385 to State Highway 79, then south along State Highway 79 to the Cheyenne River, then west along the Cheyenne River to the South Dakota-Wyoming state line, then north along the state line to the point of beginning. Unit BHE-H3A is open beginning on October 1 and remains open to October 31, inclusive. In Unit BHE-H3A 100 "any elk" licenses may be issued;

(10) Unit BHE-H3B: those portions of Custer county within a line beginning at the junction of the South Dakota-Wyoming state line and U.S. Highway 16, then east along U.S. Highway 16 to the Custer State Park western boundary, then south along the Custer State Park western boundary and the Wind Cave National Park western boundary to U.S. Highway 385, then north and west along U.S. 385 to its junction with State Highway 89 at Pringle, then south along State Highway 89 to its junction with 18 Mile Road (Forest Service 316), then west along 18 Mile Road to its junction with Pleasant Valley Road (Forest Service 715), then west along Pleasant Valley Road to Dewey Road (Forest
