
Often times wildlife biologists will refer to the winter months as a 'bottleneck', meaning a very difficult time, for wildlife and this winter has certainly born this out. Although wildlife generally put on sufficient fat reserves in the fall to help them survive South Dakota winters, the winter of 2022-2023 has posed a real challenge for wildlife across our state. Heavy snows that arrived late in December and early January covered waste grain, weeds, grass, browse and other available food sources that in many winters provide valuable food for pheasants, deer and other wildlife. In particular, deer have congregated in large groups across most of eastern South Dakota with some groups of deer numbering in the hundreds. Some of these groups of deer began to eat stored livestock feed supplies that ag producers were feeding to their livestock and as a result, GFP wildlife damage specialists and many other department staff have been helping livestock producers protect their hay, sileage, corn and other livestock feed supplies by providing livestock panels and netting. In some situations, GFP has had to provide alternate feed, like alfalfa and corn, to 'short-stop' deer and keep them from coming into farms and other livestock feeding areas. While we were hoping for a February thaw, the latest round of snow will continue to pose a challenge for wildlife, livestock producers and GFP staff.

Dark House Spearing

This was a unique course we offered for the first time in Campus history. Dark house spearing is similar to ice fishing, but you utilize a decoy and a spear to target specific fish (instead of lures and a rod).


Learn how to include healthy pollinator plants and where to start in your vegetable garden! Add a pop of color and have beneficial insect activity for this years plants.

Casting for Recovery

South Dakota will be hosting their first Casting for Recovery retreat September 15 to 17 at Outlaw Ranch in Custer, South Dakota. The retreat is open to women of all ages and in all stages of breast cancer treatment and recovery and is offered at no cost to participants. The number of participants is limited. The deadline for submitting an application for random selection to attend the retreat is July 6, 2023.

The seed was planted over four years ago at a Dakota Trout Unlimited meeting when the president of the group stated that their group was not a fly-fishing group but rather a conservation group that along with many other things also helps with fly fishing programs including Casting for Recovery. After observing and helping at the Nebraska chapter's retreat in Ponca, Nebraska, I knew South Dakota needed to have a chapter of Gasting & Recover

their own.

Casting for Recovery (Continued)

Casting for Recovery (CfR) is a nonprofit organization offering support and educational retreats for women with breast cancer. Since 1996, CfR has served more than 10,000 breast cancer survivors nationwide with the help of more than 1,800 volunteers, including medical and psychosocial professionals, fly fishing instructors and program alumnae. The mission of Casting for Recovery is to enhance the quality of life of women with breast cancer through a unique program that combines breast cancer education and peer support with the therapeutic sport of fly fishing.

Casting for Recovery (https://castingforrecovery.org/) retreats are supported by fundraising from many local individuals and organizations and need continued support. We are grateful for all the help and support we have received so far. The Nebraska chapter is supporting and mentoring us in the formation of our South Dakota chapter. Mudhole Rod Building and Tackle Crafting donated 15 fly rod blanks. Our friends at the Sioux Falls Vet Center built the rods for us. Dakota Trout Unlimited has purchased fly reels and line for the rods. Just recently we received a \$2000 grant from the Midco Foundation to purchase fly-fishing lanyards and carrying cases for the fly rods.

In addition to building our inventory of equipment we are also accepting monetary donations. To provide this weekend retreat it costs about \$1700 per participant. This covers the cost of the lodging, food, equipment, and supplies. Ultimately, the goal is to host an annual retreat alternating on the east and west of the side of the state, providing access and opportunity to women throughout South Dakota.

August 5, 1-2:30pm




Kids in Parks Signage




During the month of August on

The Outdoor Campus led a youth pheasant hunt on November 5, 2023! The hunt was a huge success with lots of wild birds being seen and plenty of shots taken!








Hello, my name is Jeff Merkle, and I am the new Nights and Weekends
