

A Look Back at Winter 2023



This year has been quite unique with the weather. We have gone from having lots of snow, to having little snow in a fairly quick time. Because of this, our ice fishing has been both on the ice and also from the dock (for safety). Either way, the fish have been biting and we held a variety of planned classes as well as "Open House" classes that didn't require any registration. Winter can sometimes feel limiting if you don't like the cold. This winter, however, we dove headlong into rod building classes. Participants in these classes were able to come in, build either an ice fishing rod, a spinning rod, or a fly fishing rod from scratch including the decorative wraps found on them.

Aside from these classes, we also offered a course on decorative diamond wraps. This advanced level class, allowed students to try their hand at a more complex and creative form of decorative wrap to adorn fishing rods.

Every year the Campus has a variety of folks take part in our Hunting 101 Program. This comprehensive hunting program includes learning how to purchase a license, time at the range, time in the field, and time processing with successful harvest. 





Volunteer Highlight





A Look Back at Summer 2024



Hunting is more then just getting into the field and having a successful harvest. It also includes the time preparing and cooking your quarry.

On August 9, the Outdoor Campus hosted a "Kids Cooking with Wild Game" class. This class taught students (age 8-15): knife skills, keeping workspace clean, safety with hot appliances, reading recipes, and how to properly cook wild game.

The class had 15 students and was led by a Campus volunteer family.

In July we hosted a "Wet and Wild" Class. The focus of this class is to help students, age 5 and up to learn more about aquatic habitats.

During the 2 classes we hosted in July, 21 students learned about aquatic habitats through reviewing what a Benthic Macroinvertebrate is and how they can be an indicator of water quality. Students got to dawn rubber boots and go searching for these critters in our local pond.



Campus Updates - AIS Curriculum Training



Over the past year, the Game, Fish and Parks, South Dakota State University, and South Dakota State University Extension Office have been collaborating to create a Middle School level Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Curriculum. The goal of this curriculum is to help students across the state better understand what AIS is, what role state level managers play in slowing the spread of AIS, and what they as students can do to slow the spread.

In conjunction with these efforts, a \$34,820 grant was awarded this group to print the curriculum, develop video aids, create loaner kits, and host a 2 day training for teachers to learn about how to use the curriculum. On May 29 and May 30, 9 teachers attended this pilot training and were given resources to be able to take home to their classrooms.

Hunting 101 - Deer

This Fall Hunting 101 season was off to a slow start, but is now moving smoother with the cooler weather. To date, we have had 39 successful hunts. Of these 39, 2 were part of our Disabled Veteran Program that is in partnership with the Grey Ghost Chapter of the Mule Deer Foundation.

This program would not be possible without the generous help of 8 landowners and 7 volunteer mentors!



On November 5th, we sent out exciting news about our event registration system. Officially on November 15th we had completely transitioned over our event registration system to the Go Outdoors South Dakota System. This system is what the Game, Fish and Parks Department has been using as the platform for purchasing a hunting and fishing license, a state park pass, and a camping reservation. This system now also houses the event registration system.

We want to remind folks, if you already have an account with Go Outdoors South Dakota, you do not need to do anything, unless you need to link kids or others to your account (see step 3). If you do need to create an account for yourself, start at step 1 below to make the switch to our new registration system.



To Create an Account

1.) You can follow the directions in this short video on how to set up an account (<u>Click here to watch</u>) or log onto <u>https://gooutdoorssouthdakota.com/</u> and click through the steps that the Go Outdoors System prompts you to complete to set up your account.

2.) Once you have created an account, you should be able to log on to Go Outdoors. If you are not planning to use your account to register anyone else up (such as your child), then you are now complete and ready to sign up for classes that are posted or future ones that will be posted.

3.) ***If you are a parent or caregiver^{***} - There is an additional step needed to register for programming for your student. Each student will need an account. There are two options for creating your student an account:

- a. If your student has an email address or you would like to get your student an email address, follow the same process you did for yourself to set up an account but do so for each of your students. This will allow you to link their accounts to yours (see step 4 for linking accounts).
- b. If your child <u>does not</u> have an email address and you <u>do not</u> desire them to obtain one at this point, you will need to visit the Outdoor Campus Sioux Falls or give us a call at 605-362-2777 so we can create your child an account that does not have an email address connected to it. You can also call 1-800-238-4168 number and a Go Outdoors employee can help.


The Outdoor Campus Archery Range is near completion. Meaning that folks in the public will be able to come to Sertoma Park and target shoot their Bows.


GFP Update - BOW


