Shooting Range Grant Application Checklist

All the following must be completed for an application to be considered:

Complete application with signature on last page
DUNS number – DUNS may be obtained at http://fedgov.dnb.come/webform
Attached copy of W-9 IRS form http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/fw9.pdf
Attach a copy of IRS non-profit organization certificate ex. 501(C)(3)
Attached zoning letter and deed/lease of shooting range
Attach detailed description of existing structures, development and use
Attach a detailed copy of description and estimates of individual costs of range enhancements
and total project costs
Attach a description of 25% cost-share source
Attach a copy of club's charter or by-laws
Attach a description of public access to the range's facilities
Sign application and mail to South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks at the address listed above or
scan and email all forms to South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks Federal Aid Coordinator at
graham.larson@state.sd.us by March 1, 2021.

There may be more items needed that will be requested from South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks if the project is considered a construction project.

Incomplete applications will not be considered!

Upon approval of a grant application:

- 1. Club (grantee) will receive cooperative agreement and contract.
- 2. Grantee will sign agreement and contract, and return to South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks.
- 3. Once signed agreement and contracts are returned, grantee will need to get **three bids** for the project and mail or email bids to South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks for approval.
- 4. South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks will review the bids and the approval of one will get referred to grantee so work can start with the approved bidder.
- 5. All work must be done within 12 months of grant approval, not bid approval.
- 6. Grantee will pay 100% of the work completed by a contractor or equipment purchases upfront. Submit proof of payment (canceled checks front and back) to South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks, South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks will reimburse grantee 75% of agreed upon amount of work or equipment costs as determined in the contract.

The club/group agrees to post in a conspicuous place upon the range, a sign, furnished by GFP, which explains that the range was constructed, in part, with Federal Aid Wildlife Restoration Funds. The club/group agrees that in the event of discontinuance of use of the range for student training or use by the public during it's useful life of the facilities, the grantee will reimburse the State seventy-five percent of the fair market value or amortized value of the equipment, materials and services purchased, provided or cost-shared, used in the equipping of the range.
