

- Agreement with DOT through 2026
 - Annual reporting and approval through DOT Commission
- Approximately 130 miles of township/county roads
- Park Interior Collector Roads limited eligibility
- 5-year plan project considerations
 - Missouri River Access Roads- Little Bend, Sutton Bay, Bush's Landing, Okobojo, West Bend, North Point, Springfield, Lewis & Clark
 - Others Shep's Canyon, Lake Thompson, Walker's Point,
 Palisades, Oakwood, Custer, Shadehill, Burke Lake

Preventative Maintenance - Roads & Bridges

- Over 700 miles of road surfaces statewide
- Approximately 40-50% of the annual budget
- Major Road Projects
 - Annual Maintenance Program- crack and chip seal
 - Parking enhancements
 - ADA Access
 - Rebuilds- Lake Louise, Burke Lake, Lewis & Clark Gavin's Point
- 20 Vehicle Bridges on the National Bridge Inventory
 - 7 Rated in Poor Condition 4 of these accepted into DOT bridge replacement program (Custer-3 Bear Butte-1)
