SPECIAL EVENTS

Raptor Rendezvous (2/7)

150 attendees learned about falconry from the F.A.R.E Group who brought a variety of raptors such as a Great Horned owl.

SPECIAL COURSES



Casting for Recovery

South Dakota held their third Casting for Recovery retreat for women somewhere along their journey with breast cancer on September 12-14 at Outlaw Ranch in Custer. This year 14 participants from 4 different states spent time learning how to fly tie, fly fish, and spent time on a guided experience at Stockade Lake, while connecting with others who share similar experiences.



HuntSAFE in the Schools

The Outdoor Campus has recently been working with the Sioux Falls School District through their Afterschool Programs with the Sioux Falls YMCA and Boys and Girls Club of the Sioux Empire to offer HuntSAFE in the Schools. This year, the program was held with Patrick Henry Middle School and Ben Reifel Middle School in both the Spring Semester and Fall Semester.

The class held in April had 40 participants and the class in August had 27 participants.

Fishing at Family Park

Every year the Outdoor Campus partners with Sioux Falls Parks and Recreation to offer free, family fishing at Family Park on Saturdays in June and July.

This year 8 classes were offered reaching 315 participants.

Fishing at Lake Lorraine

Over the past few years, the Outdoor Campus has had a unique partnership with Friessen Construction to offer free fishing during classes at Lake Lorraine. This year, the Outdoor Campus held 6 traditional fishing programs at Lake Lorraine reaching 569 participants. The Outdoor Campus also held 2 snorkel spearfishing classes at Lake Lorraine reaching 10 participants.

Hunting 101

2025 proved to be another successful year for the Hunting 101 program in Sioux Falls. 36 hunters took part in the spring turkey season, 53 took part in the fall deer season, and 10 disabled veterans took part in a special deer hunt in the fall. These programs are supported not only by the Department, but also by landowners (12 separate properties were hunted in 2025) and volunteer mentors (7 volunteers gave 668 hours of service).

OTHER SERVICES

ROOM USAGE

The Outdoor Campus encourages the use of our facility as a free meeting space for the public.

135 meetings were held by nongovernment organizations, city departments, state departments, and other clubs.

LOANER EQUIPMENT

The Outdoor Campus has a wide range of loaner equipment available for the public to use for free including Critter Crates, snowshoes, live traps, life jackets, waterfowl decoy bags, waterfowl decoy trailers, and action track chairs.

The most popular option were the critter crates with 85 check outs.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS



Construction began on the Outdoor Campus Facility

In March, Construction began on the Outdoor Campus Sioux Falls Phase 2. Phase 2 includes an indoor archery range, new classrooms, new restrooms, a game processing space, and more. This construction is slated to continue until completion in October 2026.




Archery Range Opened

On March 16, 2025, the Outdoor Campus Outdoor Archery Range officially opened to the public. This 60-yard archery range is equipped with both traditional and 3D targets and is free for the public to use anytime Sertoma Park is open (5am-10pm). Since opening, the range has had 14,770 members of the public utilize it.



Addition of Grassland Crate

In May 2025, the Outdoor Campus Sioux Falls was one of four initial locations that received a SD Grassland Initiative Education Tote. The Outdoor Campus along with other member organizations of the SD Grassland Initiative worked to help create these grassland totes to help spread grassland education throughout South Dakota. In its first year, the Sioux Falls tote was checked out 4 times, reaching 363 individuals.



Big Sioux Fly-Fishing Club

In its second year of existence, the Big Sioux Fly-Fishing Club continues to be a big hit within the greater Sioux Falls Community with over 70 active members. Each month, members meet up to fly ty at the Outdoor Campus or, weather permitting, go fly fishing. The group has gone to a variety of different locations including Rollings GPA, Lake Vermillion State Park, and Heritage Pond in Crooks. This Outdoor Campus/Friends of the Big Sioux River sponsored and led Club is a great way for folks of all experience levels to join a group of like-minded anglers.
