## Campus Updates - Registration Platform Change

On November 5th, we sent out exciting news about our event registration system. Officially on November 15th we had completely transitioned over our event registration system to the Go Outdoors South Dakota System. This system is what the Game, Fish and Parks Department has been using as the platform for purchasing a hunting and fishing license, a state park pass, and a camping reservation. This system now also houses the event registration system.


We want to remind folks, if you already have an account with Go Outdoors South Dakota, you do not need to do anything, unless you need to link kids or others to your account (see step 3). If you do need to create an account for yourself, start at step 1 below to make the switch to our new registration system.



#### To Create an Account

- 1.) You can follow the directions in this short video on how to set up an account (<u>Click here to watch</u>) or log onto <a href="https://gooutdoorssouthdakota.com/">https://gooutdoorssouthdakota.com/</a> and click through the steps that the Go Outdoors System prompts you to complete to set up your account.
- 2.) Once you have created an account, you should be able to log on to Go Outdoors. If you are not planning to use your account to register anyone else up (such as your child), then you are now complete and ready to sign up for classes that are posted or future ones that will be posted.
- 3.) \*\*\*If you are a parent or caregiver\*\*\* There is an additional step needed to register for programming for your student. Each student will need an account. There are two options for creating your student an account:
  - a. If your student has an email address or you would like to get your student an email address, follow the same process you did for yourself to set up an account but do so for each of your students. This will allow you to link their accounts to yours (see step 4 for linking accounts).
  - b. If your child <u>does not</u> have an email address and you <u>do not</u> desire them to obtain one at this point, you will need to visit the Outdoor Campus Sioux Falls or give us a call at 605-362-2777 so we can create your child an account that does not have an email address connected to it. You can also call 1-800-238-4168 number and a Go Outdoors employee can help.

#### **Campus Updates - Casting for Recovery**



On October 4-6, the second ever Casting for Recovery South Dakota was held at NeSoDak Bible Camp in Waubay. This program focuses on providing a retreat for breast cancer survivors. Throughout the weekend, participants spend time getting to know each other, learning about fly fishing skills, and also meeting with medical professionals about breast cancer.

The capstone of the program is a fly fishing experience where participants are matched with a guide to spend time fishing.

#### **HuntSAFE** in the Schools

This Fall marked the 3rd ever HuntSAFE in the Schools program offered in the Sioux Falls area. This year we expanded the program to include both Ben Reiffel Middle School and Patrick Henry Middle School. The program involves 2 weeks of training. Week 1 is in the classroom and is learning about laws, regulations, and safety. Week 2 is hands on time including understanding how to safely handle a firearm, cross a fence, and finally a live fire opportunity. We had 27 total participants take part in this experience.

# Campus Updates - Action Trackchair®



# **Campus Updates - Expansion Construction**

The Sioux Falls Outdoor Campus Archery Range is near completion!

As you can tell from the photos, all concrete is poured, the archery shed is complete, the firing line structures are complete, and safety fences are up. The final piece we are waiting on is the metal roofing and signage. Once that is complete, Phase 1 of the Campus Expansion Project will be complete.

Our plan with this range is that anyone in the public will be able to bring their own bow and use it during normal Sertoma Park hours (5:00 am - 10:00 pm).

# **GFP Update - Elk Virtual Reality Tour**





Over the last year, Game, Fish and Parks Education staff have worked to create a unique educational opportunity. Through a generous grant from the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, the "Elk of the Black Hills Virtual Reality Tour" was created. This program immerses the user in a manipulative, digital environment allowing learning through video, text, and more.

The program walks students through what elk are, the habitats they can be found in, as well as jobs and organizations that work to help maintain elk populations.

Along with the immersive video, a 2-sided worksheet can be downloaded and used to gauge student retention of information. If a student completes the program, they are eligible to request a ELK VR Program sticker.

#### **GFP Update - BOW**


BOW or Becoming an Outdoor Woman, is a national education program that strives to make women more comfortable in and more aware of the outdoor world around them.

- · When passing, slow your speed and politely call out, "On your left."
- · Avoid skate skiing on or over the groomed classic lanes.
- · Be respectful of wildlife and private property.
- Keep the trails litter free.
- Be courteous to other trail users.



Yield to grooming equipment at all times. For your safety, and the groomers safety, always move to the opposite side of the trail from the machine.



Dogs are allowed. Please keep them off the groomed classic lanes and scoop your poop.



Bicycles are not allowed on Sertoma Park's groomed trails.

Friday February 7 from 5pm-8pm


Raptor Rendezvous is back in 2025!


