LIGHT GOOSE CONSERVATION ORDER

Information provided in this section pertains only to the Spring Light Goose Conservation Order in South Dakota. The previous section reported only on the regular season.

The 2022 Light Goose Conservation Order covered 14 February - 15 May statewide. The daily bag and possession limits were unlimited. To hunt light geese, residents were required to hold a small game, 1-day small game, adult or senior combination, or youth small game license plus a migratory bird certification. Nonresidents were required to obtain a nonresident Spring Light Goose or a nonresident Youth Spring Light Goose license. Hunters were not required to possess a federal waterfowl stamp to participate in the conservation order.

Harvest surveys were sent to both resident and nonresident hunters. In 2022, there were a projected 6,430 license holders who hunted at least one day for light geese during the conservation order dates (2,101 residents, 4,329 nonresidents). From the survey responses, there were a projected total of 169,646 light geese harvested.

The average days hunted projected to a total of 28,466 recreation days for the conservation order. Hunters in Brown, Yankton, Clark, Edmunds, and Kingsbury counties had the highest reported harvest, accounting for 52% of the total estimate.
