Turkeys and Turkey Hunting

Learn all about the wild turkey. We will learn tricks for hunting South Dakota's wild turkeys. Friday, April 6, 10 to 11:30 a.m.

Seeds and Plants

Spring is the growing season. We will look into the process of a seed turning into a plant. We will plant some seeds, too. **Wednesday, April 11, 10 to 11:30 a.m.**

Spring Nature Hike

Join us for an age-appropriate tour and learn about the wildlife and plants along our trails. We might see rabbits, beavers, ducks or geese, too! Come dressed for the weather. Friday, April 20, 1 to 2:30 p.m.

Fishing Fun

Learn the basics of what it takes to fish in South Dakota and how to do it safely. We'll talk about basic equipment, safety and ethics before heading out to the pond and dropping in a line. **Tuesday, April 24, 1** to 2:30 p.m.

Archery Basics

Learn how to safely handle and shoot a youth-sized bow and arrow. Practice aiming at our 3-D animal targets and learn how to take an ethical shot. (Younger children may need parent/guardian assistance.) **Friday, May 4, 1 to 2:30 p.m.**

BB Gun and Air Rifle Basics

Learn the basics of safely operating BB guns and air rifles. Spend time on the range, practicing your shot. (Younger children may need parent/guardian assistance.) Friday, May 11, 1 to 2:30 p.m.


Fishing Fun

Greetings Home School Families!

This year I will be starting a new program for home school youth ages 10 to 16. I will be personally training and guiding them on a variety of hunts. We will be doing some classroom instruction going over all the basics and benefits of hunting including how to get started, along with some time at the gun range and processing.

A lot of this program will actually be spent in the field, hunting. We will start off this spring, turkey hunting, This fall we will continue with some duck hunting, pheasant and deer hunting. This class will be ongoing throughout the year and will be a bit of time commitment with early mornings and late evenings.

The goal of this class is to introduce and/or make students/families more comfortable hunting in hopes of building a lifelong passion for hunting. I will be looking for only a handful of families that are interested in participating and will set up a time to interview and answer any questions you may have.

The reason for the age restrictions is that youth those ages are guaranteed mentored and youth tags. Parents/guardians are required to attend, and may be able to hunt for turkey and deer if they can draw a tag.
