John I attended a meeting in Aberdeen last Thursday evening regarding fishing length regulations on some of our eastern lakes. I will be unable to attend your Commission meeting in Aberdeen this Thursday ( will be out of town) and would ask that you pass the following information onto the commissioners regarding these changes.

I am co-founder and past president of the Northeastern South Dakota Walleye Club, our current membership is just over 100. Over the past week I have contacted and talked in person to 23 of our members plus 6 that were at the meeting in Aberdeen. All put two of these members are in agreement with the Webster and Watertown staff that attended the Aberdeen meeting. I have also talked to several people that are not members of our club, put past members and concerned fishermen in our area. Everyone has the same concerns as to what is happening to the walleyes in these lakes. Even though we are not educated in the field of fisheries most of us see that the current length restrictions on these lakes has past it's positive point and it is time to remove those restrictions and allow anglers to take some of these smaller fish out before they die of natural causes or starvation.

The only two people that I talked to that are opposed to the removal of the restrictions have personal agendas . One has a total dislike for other fishermen, especially non- residents and the other one feels that the 13-14 inch fish will live to reach or exceed the 15inch limit if given time to do so, His bottom line is not to see more fishing pressure on these lakes.

Over all, the majority of the people I polled are in agreement with your fisheries staff and would support their recommendations on the removal of the length limit restrictions on Walleye and Bass on these lakes. Thank you for your time.
