LANDOWNER PERMISSION REQUIRED
Permission is required to hunt private land in South Dakota. Every year Game, Fish and Parks receives complaints from hunters who drew a license and couldn't get permission to hunt private land once the season opened. Do not apply just because licenses are available. Have permission to hunt before you apply. If you don't get permission before you apply, you may not be able to get it during the season.

APPLY BY COMPUTER AT: gfp.sd.gov
On the GFP home page you will find a link at the top of the page to "Licenses and Permits." Click on "Hunting and Fishing," and then on the "apply online" link under Limited Licenses. Follow the instructions to complete and submit your application. You will be required to provide all the standard application information, and you will submit the fee using your credit card number. The end result is your big game application is placed directly into the computer file where licenses are drawn and issued, with no additional handling of a paper application. If you are eligible for preference for a season it will be added automatically. As you grow accustomed to filing electronically, we feel you will find it your most convenient option for applying. In addition, applicants can access the GFP website to check the status of their application. Enter/Create your username and password combination, log in, and click on "View Submitted Applications."

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Drawing Statistics Available: Applicants may access last year's drawing statistics online from the GFP home page. On the GFP home page you will find a link at the top of the page to "Licenses and Permits." Click on "Hunting and Fishing," and in the right-hand column you will find a link to "License Draw Statistics." Click and follow instructions. The same link is available as an option when you sign into the online application system. Drawing information will be available from several past seasons. 2012 information will be available when this year's drawing is complete.

Residency

To apply for a resident license, a person must:

- Have a domicile within South Dakota for at least 90 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of application for, purchasing, or attempting to purchase any hunting, fishing, or trapping license/permit. A domicile is a person's established, fixed, and permanent home to which the person, whenever absent, has the present intention of returning; and
- Make no claim of residency in any other state or foreign country for any purpose; and
- Claim no resident hunting, fishing, or trapping privileges in any other state or foreign country; and
- Prior to any application for any license, transfer to SD the person's driver's license and motor vehicle registrations.

EXCEPTION: The following persons are eligible for resident licenses:

- Any person who previously had a domicile in SD who is absent due to business of the United States or SD, or is serving in the armed forces of the US or the spouse of an active duty military person;
- Any person who previously had a domicile in SD who is absent due to the person's regular attendance at a post-high school institution as a full-time student;
- Any person in the active military of the US or that person's spouse who is continuously stationed in SD;
- Any person who is a patient in any war veterans' hospital within SD;
- Any person who is an employee of the veterans' administration or any veterans' hospital in SD;
- Any person residing on restricted military reservations in SD;
- Any person attending regularly a post-high school institution in SD as a full-time student for 30 days or more immediately preceding the application;
- Any foreign exchange student over 16 years of age attending a public or private high school who has resided in the state for 30 days or more preceding the application;
- Any foreign exchange student who is between the ages of 12 and 16 who has completed the GFP course of instruction in the safe handling

of firearms and has been issued a certificate of competency upon completion of instruction and who has resided in SD for 30 days or more preceding application for a license;

- Any person who is a minor dependent of a resident of SD.

Termination of Residency

A person (other than a person who fits into one of the previous EXCEPTIONS) is deemed to have terminated their South Dakota resident hunting, fishing, and trapping status if the person does any of the following:

- Applies for, purchases, or accepts a resident hunting, fishing, or trapping license issued by another state or foreign country;
- Registers to vote in another state or foreign country;
- Accepts a driver's license issued by another state or foreign country; or
- Moves to any other state or foreign country and makes it the person's domicile or makes any claim of residency for any purpose in the other state or foreign country. However, a person who has lawfully acquired a resident hunting, fishing, or trapping license and who leaves the state after acquiring the license to take up residency elsewhere may continue to exercise all the privileges granted by the license until the license expires if the person's respective privileges are not revoked or suspended.

Social Security Number

You are required to provide the last 4 digits of your social security number. The Social Security Number information is required from all U.S. residents before this application will be processed [SDCL 25-7A-56.2]. This information will be kept confidential. The information is required to be in compliance with state law on collection of delinquent child support payments.

South Dakota law prohibits the issuance or renewal of any hunting or fishing license if an individual owes \$1,000 or more in past due child support unless the individual enters into a repayment agreement with the Dept. of Social Services for payment of the delinquent child support [SDCL 25-7A-56; 25-7A-1(28)]. There is a requirement to enter into a repayment agreement with the Dept. of Social Services even if the individual is presently making child support payments, or if child support is being withheld from wages or income. To enter into the required repayment agreement, individuals must contact the Dept. of Social Services – Office of Child Support Enforcement, 700 Governor's Drive - Kneip Building, Pierre SD 57501, or call (605) 773-6456.

Age Eligibility

- Residents must be 12 years old to hunt. Those who will turn 12 by December 31, 2012 may hunt after Sept. 1.
- Residents under age 16 must successfully complete a HuntSAFE course unless taking part in a mentored hunt.

(Age Eligibility continued)

- Residents who have not completed the HuntSAFE course at the time of application must use a paper application and leave that information blank on the application form. If drawn, their license will be held until the License Office is notified of the HuntSAFE card number once the course has been successfully completed.
- Nonresidents under age 16 must include the certificate number from their hunter safety card, or a current or previous hunting license issued to them from any state.
- Residents and nonresidents who have not completed the HuntSAFE course at the time of application must use a paper application and leave that information blank on the application form. If drawn, their license will be held until the License Office is notified of the HuntSAFE card number once the course has been successfully completed.

Bowhunter Education

Possession of a National Bowhunter Education Foundation certificate or a certificate of completion from a bowhunter education course approved by any state or provincial government is required of all archery big game licensees 11-15 years of age regardless of previous experience or licensing, all first-time archery big game licensees regardless of age, and all archery elk licensees. Individuals age 16 and older who have previously held an archery tag in any state are exempt from this course requirement when archery hunting deer, antelope or turkey.

Submitting Fees

You must submit the appropriate license fee to cover the cost of each

season applied for on this multiple application form. One check may be written to cover the cost of all seasons you apply for on this form. We recommend the fee be sent in the form of a personal check, but a cashier's check, money order or cash will be accepted. Cash is not recommended. Make checks payable to "South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks." Payment for applications submitted online must be made with a valid credit card (Visa or MasterCard). Your credit card will not be charged until, and only if you are successful in the drawing. Nonpayment in the form of a cancelled credit card will result in your license being withheld and the blocking of any future license purchases until the unpaid fee, along with any penalties, is paid in full. A bad check will either void the license if the draw has not yet occurred; or if the drawing has been completed, it will result in the blocking of any future license purchases until the unpaid fee, along with any back check fees and penalties are paid in full.

Application Rules

- Applications not properly filled out will be returned.
- Licenses may not be transferred to another person.

Submitting Applications

Applications may be submitted online or on the forms provided in this pamphlet (the forms may be photocopied), and may be mailed in the self-addressed envelopes provided or in the applicant's envelope. Proper postage must be affixed to the envelope to ensure delivery. Mail to: GFP License Office; 20641 SD Hwy 1806; Fort Pierre, SD 57532.

SEASON APPLICATION INFORMATION

The unit-type designations apply to both resident and nonresident licenses. Use the entire 8-digit number in the first column when filling out "Unit-Type" on the application.

The license fee includes a \$5 surcharge established by the South Dakota legislature. Surcharge monies are divided evenly between programs for wildlife damage management and public hunting land access, programs that benefit both landowners and hunters.

INDIAN TRUST LANDS. State licenses are valid on private, deeded lands within the exterior boundaries of an Indian reservation. Persons applying to hunt on Tribal lands should contact the appropriate tribal office concerning tribal lands.

YOUTH DEER

Season Dates: Sept. 8, 2012-Jan. 15, 2013.

License Eligibility: Resident and nonresident youth that are or will be at least 12 years old on Dec. 31, 2012 and are younger than 18 years old on June 30, 2012 may purchase a license and hunt the entire season.

Individual License Quota: Applicants may have up to TWO (2) Youth Deer licenses. Maximum one license for unit YOD-ST1-03.

Special Requirements: Youth must be accompanied by an unarmed adult unless the adult has a firearm big game license valid for the same geographic area and time of year as the youth hunter or the adult is carrying a pistol and possesses a valid concealed pistol permit. Big game hunters using a firearm must wear the required fluorescent orange.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: _____

Applicants may apply for a license at any time, however please note the age eligibility requirements. Applicants who delay applying for a license should be aware that ample time must be allowed for processing and mailing an application. This can take up to one week, so please submit applications well in advance of when you will be hunting. Applicants may have one YOD-ST1 and one YOD-LM1 license. Licenses are unlimited for this season so no drawing is required.

Season/Unit/Type Choices _____

YOD-ST1- STATEWIDE, except Sand Lake Refuge, Lacreek Refuge, Lake Andes Refuge, Waubay National and State refuges, Farm Island State Recreation Area, LaFramboise Island State Nature Area, Custer State Park, and Fort Meade Bureau of Land Management South Unit and the signed portion of the North Unit are closed to this season.

Maximum ONE license of this type per individual.

03: License valid for one Any Antlerless Deer.

Unlimited resident (\$5); Unlimited nonresident (\$10)

YOD-LM1- LIMITED Statewide; not valid in Black Hills Fire Protection District, Sand Lake Refuge, Lacreek Refuge, Lake Andes Refuge, Waubay National and State refuges, Farm Island State Recreation Area, LaFramboise Island State Nature Area, Custer State Park, and Fort Meade Bureau of Land Management South Unit and the signed portion of the North Unit and counties of Roberts, Grant, Codington, Lake, Moody, Minnehaha, Turner, Lincoln, McCook, Brookings, Deuel, Hamlin and Yankton (see map) are closed to this season.

03: License valid for one Any Antlerless Deer.

Unlimited resident (\$5); Unlimited nonresident (\$10)

ARCHERY ANTELOPE

Season Dates: Aug. 18 - Oct. 31 except when and where a state firearm antelope season is open Sept. 29-Oct. 14.

License Eligibility: Residents and nonresidents may apply.

Individual License Quota: Applicants may apply for and receive one license.

Access Permit: South Dakota resident license holders who possess a Type 41 permit may apply for an access permit to hunt those portions of Custer and Pennington counties within the Black Hills Fire Protection District and not within Unit 27A. (See Access Permits section on next page)

APPLICATION DEADLINE: _____

Applicants may purchase a license throughout the season by applying to the License Office in Ft. Pierre either online or through the mail. Please allow ample time for the license to be processed and mailed to you before you leave for your hunt.

Season/Unit/Type Choice: _____

ARA-ST1- The same area of the state that will be open during the firearm antelope season plus all of Brule, Buffalo, Campbell and Hand counties.

41: Valid for one Any Antelope.

Unlimited resident (\$35); Unlimited nonresident (\$285)

ARCHERY DEER

Season Dates: Sept. 22, 2012-Jan. 15, 2013

All unfilled licenses convert to antlerless tags beginning Jan. 1, 2013 and are valid through Jan. 15 except for the following:

- Sand Lake National Wildlife Refuge in Brown Co. is open Oct. 15, 2012 - Jan. 15, 2013 except during the refuge firearms deer season. Archery antlerless tags are not valid in Sand Lake NWR. Changes to placement of deer stands and areas open to deer hunting have been made. Please consult Sand Lake National Wildlife Refuge for specifics <http://www.fws.gov/sandlake/>, write 39650 Sand Lake Drive, Columbia, SD 57433, or call (605)885-6320.
- Portions of Lacreek National Wildlife Refuge in Bennett Co. are open Sept. 22 - Dec. 31 except during firearms deer seasons. To hunt within Lacreek Refuge, hunters must obtain a free permit at the refuge headquarters. Additional restrictions may apply.
- The Waubay Lake State Game Refuge and Waubay National Wildlife Refuge in Day Co. are open Sept. 22 - Dec. 31 except during the refuge firearms deer seasons.
- Most state parks, recreation areas, nature areas and lakeside use areas are open Oct. 1, 2012-Jan. 15, 2013. All archery permits are valid in Farm Island Recreation Area and LaFramboise Island Nature Area in Hughes County from Oct 1 - Dec 31.
- Custer State Park is closed to archery deer hunting, except for special permit hunting issued specifically for the Park.
- In addition to a regular license, a free access permit is required to hunt the Adams Homestead and Nature Preserve, Blood Run Nature Area and the Sioux Falls Antlerless Area. (*See Access Permits section*)

License Eligibility: Residents and nonresidents may apply.

Individual License Quota: Hunters may possess a total of five archery deer licenses with the following restrictions;

- No more than one statewide “any deer” license (ARD-ST1-01); with this license you are ineligible for both the ARD-ER1-01 and ARD-WR1-01 license
- No more than one East River “any deer” license (ARD-ER1-01) and/or one West River “any deer” license (ARD-WR1-01)
- No more than one statewide “any antlerless deer” license (ARDST1-03) (*see examples of license combinations on at right*)

APPLICATION DEADLINES:

Applicants may purchase a license throughout the season by applying to the License Office in Ft. Pierre either online or through the mail. Please allow ample time for the license to be processed and mailed to you before you leave for your hunt.

Season/Unit/Type Choices:

ARD-ST1- STATEWIDE. (*see restrictions on 03 antlerless tags below*)

- 01:** Valid for one Any Deer. Maximum of ONE license of this unit/type per individual.
Unlimited resident (\$35); Unlimited nonresident (\$285)
- 03:** Valid for one Any Antlerless Deer, statewide except Black Hills Fire Protection District and Sand Lake NWR. Maximum of ONE license of this unit/type per individual.
Unlimited residents (\$15); Unlimited nonresident (\$55)

ARD-LM1- LIMITED statewide; all areas open to archery hunting, except Black Hills Fire Protection District, Sand Lake NWR, and counties of Roberts, Grant, Codington, Lake, Moody, Minnehaha, Turner, Lincoln, McCook, Brookings, Deuel, Hamlin and Yankton (*see map on next page*)

- 03:** Valid for one Any Antlerless Deer.
Unlimited resident (\$15); Unlimited nonresident (\$55)
- 09:** Valid for TWO Any Antlerless Deer.
Unlimited resident (\$25); Unlimited nonresident (\$80)

ARD-ER1- All Counties East of the Missouri River.

- 01:** Valid for one Any Deer.
Unlimited resident (\$35); Unlimited nonresident (\$285)

ARD-WR1- All Counties West of the Missouri River.

- 01:** Valid for one Any Deer.
Unlimited resident (\$35); Unlimited nonresident (\$285)

ARCHERY DEER QUOTA DETAILS:

Hunters may possess a total of five archery deer licenses with the following restrictions;

- No more than one statewide “any deer” license (ARD-ST1-01)
- No more than one East River “any deer” license (ARD-ER1-01) and/or one West River “any deer” license (ARD-WR1-01)
- If you purchase the statewide any deer license, ARD-ST1-01, you are ineligible for both the East River and West River any deer licenses
- No more than one statewide “any antlerless deer” license (ARD-ST1-03)

EXAMPLES:

- If you purchase the ARD-ST1-01 license you are eligible to purchase up to four additional archery antlerless licenses, however only one of those four may be the ARD-ST1-03 license.
- If you purchase the ARD-ER1-01 or ARD-WR1-01 license you may purchase up to four additional archery antlerless licenses, however only one of those four may be the ARD-ST1-03 license.
- If you purchase both the ARD-ER1-01 and ARD-WR1-01 license, you may have up to three additional archery antlerless licenses, however only one of those three may be the ARD-ST1-03 license.
- If you wish to purchase only antlerless permits, two options would be available. You could purchase the one ARD-ST1-03 and up to four ARD-LM1-03 or ARDLM1-09 licenses; or, you could purchase any combination of five ARD-LM1-03 or ARD-LM1-09 licenses.

* NEW FOR 2012 - ACCESS PERMITS

A free Access Permit is required to hunt archery deer in Adams Homestead and Nature Preserve and portions of Dakota Dunes in Union county, Blood Run Nature Area near Sioux Falls and the Sioux Falls Antlerless Area.

A free Access Permit is required to hunt archery antelope in Custer and Pennington counties within the Black Hills Fire Protection District and not within Unit 27A.

To obtain these free Access Permits, you must first purchase the license type that is valid for those units. After you have received your license, the Access Permits may be applied for only on the SD GF&P website. The Access Permits are a limited draw.

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APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Season/Unit/Type Choices:** Fill in your unit-type choice from the choices provided with each season. Check the box next to the season in which you are claiming landowner/operator preference. The second choice, for those seasons that allow a second choice, is optional. You may apply for multiple seasons with this form. For example, you may apply for Prairie Turkey on one line, Archery Turkey the next, Black Hills Turkey the next and Custer State Park Turkey on the next. You would only need to fill out one form and provide one check to cover the cost of all applications. Please remember, if you are applying together in the same envelope with other individuals, all unit choices must be identical or the application will be rejected.
- 2. Land Operator Preference:** If you qualify for and want landowner/operator preference, you must provide the legal description of the land that qualifies you. By completing the land descriptions below, you are declaring that you qualify for landowner/operator preference as explained under APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS of this document and are applying for a license using that requirement. Nonresidents do not qualify for landowner/operator preference. Landowner preference applies to first choice only for a specific season.
- 3. Residency:** Check the appropriate box to indicate that you qualify and are applying as a resident, or applying as a nonresident.
- 4. Social Security Number:** Last four digits only. This information is required by state law and applications that do not include the SSN will be rejected. See information under "application requirements."
- 5. Date of Birth:** Enter your date of birth, month first, followed by day and year. For example, a birth date of March 8, 1971, would be entered 03-08-1971.
- 6. Driver License or Identification Card Number:** If you possess one, please enter your driver's license number, even if it duplicates your Social Security Number. Residents over age 16 without a driver's license must enter your state-issued and expiration-dated South Dakota ID card number. Include the two-letter abbreviation for the state or province your driver's license was issued from. Youth without a driver's license or ID card number, see instruction No. 8.
- 7. Print Name:** Print your complete name, with FIRST NAME first, followed by middle initial and last name. Leave a space between each.
- 8. HuntSAFE Card Number:** This number must be entered for resident youth ages 12-15. Nonresident youth are required to use their hunter safety card number or the number of a current or previous hunting license issued to them from any state. If the hunter safety course has not been taken at the time of application, but will be completed before the hunt, leave this blank. If drawn, the license will be held until the License Office is notified of the HuntSAFE card number after the course has been successfully completed.
- 9. Mailing Address:** Licenses and refunds will be mailed to the address provided on the application. Those returned as "undeliverable" will be held in the License Office until a correct address is provided.
- 10. Height:** measured in feet and inches. **Weight:** registered in pounds.
- 11. Phone Number:** Enter your daytime phone number. This information is kept confidential and is used only for contacting and/or surveying hunters.
- 12. E-mail Address:** This information is optional, but is helpful if there is a need to contact or send updates on information. We request that you fill this out if you have a personal e-mail address.
- 13. Archery Applicant Information:** All big game archery applicants under age 16, all first-time archery applicants, and all archery elk applicants must be able to answer the first question "YES" and provide their National Bowhunter Education certificate number. All other archery hunters must either be able to answer the first question "YES" and provide your certificate number or answer the second question "YES" and provide the state and year when you last were licensed.
- 14. Gender:** Check the appropriate box.
- 15. Mailing List Opt-Out:** Applications are considered "public record" and from time to time the Game, Fish and Parks Commission receives requests from groups and businesses for these names and addresses. If you wish to keep your name from appearing on these lists, you may check this box. You will still be included in official GFP mailings such as season surveys.
- 16. Suspended Privileges:** Any person who has had hunting, fishing or trapping privileges revoked or suspended in any state or country may not purchase a preference point or license for or exercises that same privilege in South Dakota during the period of the revocation or suspension.
- 17. Donate To TIPS or SAH:** You may make a donation to the Turn In Poachers (TIPs) or Sportsmen Against Hunger (SAH) programs by checking one of the blanks at the bottom of the application and including an amount greater than the license fee in your payment. Any amount over the license fee will be donated to the selected program when one of the boxes is checked. If neither of the boxes is checked, the overpayment will be refunded. Your contributions are tax deductible.
- 18. Sign Application:** This application must be signed to be valid. A parent or guardian must sign the application for youth under age 16. Applications that are not signed will not be processed for a license.

*Review your application form to make certain all required information is completed and accurate.
