## RESOLUTION 20 - 01

WHEREAS, the Frank L. Sieh Revocable Trust, dated March 6, 2008, 2715 Old Pond Cove, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46819, owns real property (Property) described as:

West Half of the Northwest Quarter (W $\frac{1}{2}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Twenty-five (25), Township One Hundred Twenty-four (124) North, Range Sixty-two (62) West of the 5th P.M., Brown County, South Dakota, subject to all other easements, restrictions, and reservations shown of record in the office of the Register of Deeds of Brown County, South Dakota, containing 80 acres, more or less; and

Whereas, pursuant to its wishes, the Frank L. Sieh Revocable Trust desires to gift and transfer title to the Property to the South Dakota Department of Game, Fish and Parks (Department) for use as a Game Production Area; and

Whereas, the Department has evaluated and determined that the Property would serve very well as a Game Production Area, offering wildlife habitat, public hunting, and other wildlife related outdoor recreational opportunities; and

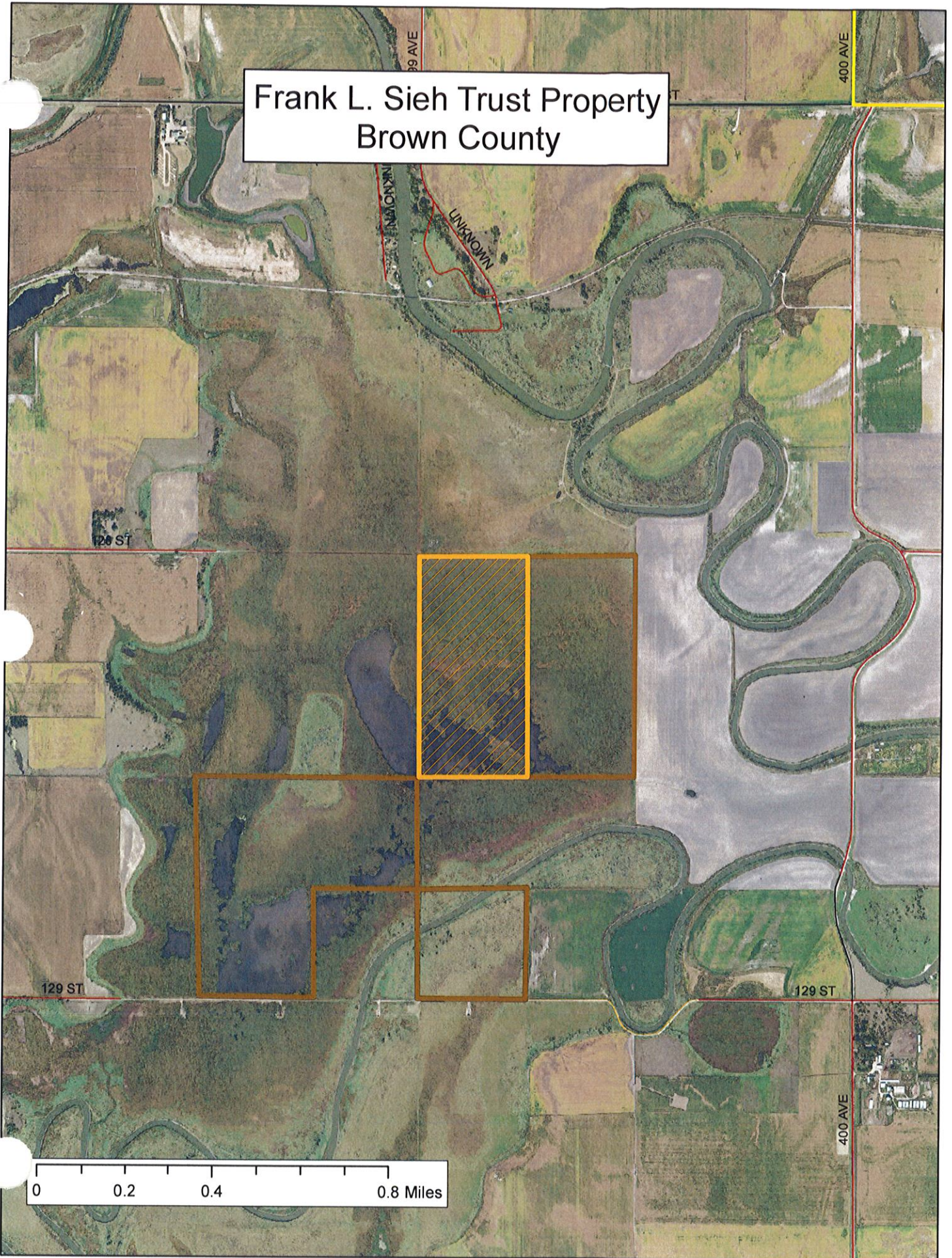
Whereas, the Department is authorized to accept gifts of property for Game Production Area as per SDCL 41-2-19 and desires to accept the gift of the Property upon confirmation of the gift by the Game, Fish and Parks Commission; and

Whereas, the Game, Fish and Parks Commission desires to acknowledge the Department's acceptance of this gift of the Property from Frank L. Sieh Revocable Trust for use as a Game Production Area, and further acknowledge the extreme generosity of Frank L. Sieh Revocable Trust.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Game, Fish and Parks Commission does hereby confirm the decision by the Department to accept the transfer and gift of the Property from Frank L. Sieh Revocable Trust to be used as a Game Production Area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Game, Fish and Parks Commission, on behalf of the citizens and sportspersons of South Dakota, does hereby acknowledge and express its deepest appreciation and gratitude to Frank L. Sieh Revocable Trust for its generosity, and further acknowledge the outdoor recreation opportunities this gift will provide to South Dakotans for many years to come.

# BLACK HILLS FISHERIES MANAGEMENT AREA PLAN

## WHY IS A FISHERIES PLAN NEEDED?

The purpose of this plan is to guide fisheries management based on the missions of the South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks (GFP). This plan is a dynamic tool addressing the issues, challenges and opportunities in managing the Black Hills Fisheries Management Area (BHFMA). The Issues section lists the current issues involving fisheries for this management area. The Objectives sections lists measurable and time-bound objectives, along with specific strategies. Progress towards meeting these objectives will be evaluated prior to developing subsequent plans.

## MAJOR ISSUES IDENTIFIED FOR BLACK HILLS FISHERIES

- » Shore fishing opportunities on small reservoirs are limited due to siltation and vegetation.
- » Many small reservoirs are over 80 years old, degraded, and unable to provide quality fisheries.
- » The effectiveness of stocking larger rainbow trout to reduce mortality due to northern pike predation has not been evaluated.
- » Existing information on the lake trout population is insufficient to evaluate stocking success, reproduction, and regulation effectiveness.
- » High use during summer by various user groups at reservoirs leads to conflict, impaired access, and the potential for lower overall angler satisfaction.
- » Sedimentation from land use practices negatively impacts habitat quality and fish populations in Black Hills streams.
  - » Adult trout habitat may be limited in some streams, limiting fish population quality.
- » Extremely high and low water releases from Pactola and Deerfield Dams negatively impact downstream trout populations.

## OBJECTIVES ADDRESSING SOME OF THESE ISSUES

- » Improve shore fishing access on a minimum of two small reservoirs.
- » Estimate angler use and satisfaction on a minimum of five small reservoirs.
- » Determine effects of stocking larger (15 inch) rainbow trout in Pactola and Deerfield Reservoirs.
- » Determine return rates to anglers of hatchery-reared rainbow trout on a minimum of five small impoundments by 2023.
- » Complete a fish habitat renovation of Stockade Lake.
- » Complete at least one in-stream habitat project on a secondary watershed (i.e. non-Rapid and Spearfish Creek watersheds).
- » Improve instream habitat and flow conditions in at least two sections of Rapid or Castle Creeks.

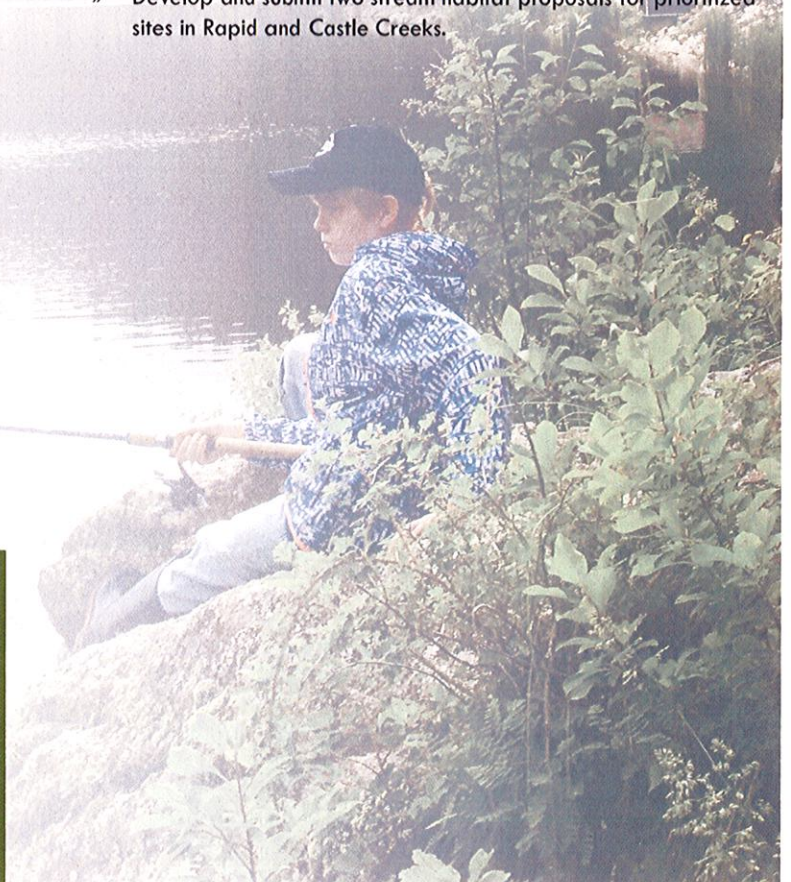
## STRATEGIES TO ACCOMPLISH THESE OBJECTIVES INCLUDE:

- » Use vegetation removal and dredging and add fishing piers to small reservoirs to improve shore access, focusing on Iron Creek Lake, Strawberry Hill Pond and Reausaw Lake.
- » Complete angler surveys at Sunday Gulch Pond, Grace Coolidge Ponds, Reausaw Lake, Silver City walk-in fishery, Kinney Canyon walk-in fishery and Sturgis Reservoirs.
- » Conduct a study of effects of stocking large (15 inch) rainbow trout on return rate to anglers, angler satisfaction and fish communities in Pactola and Deerfield Reservoirs.
- » Evaluate stocking strategies for put-and-take trout stockings in small reservoirs including, but not limited to: Bismarck Lake, Horsetheif Lake, Iron Creek Lake, and Dalton Lake.
- » Develop and implement an aquatic habitat renovation plan for Stockade Lake including increasing in-lake structure (e.g. gravel bars, woody debris), dredging, draw downs and aeration, etc. based on cost and available resources.
- » Engage Rapid Creek water users and managers about maintaining adequate winter flows for trout below Pactola Reservoir.
- » Develop and submit two stream habitat proposals for prioritized sites in Rapid and Castle Creeks.
