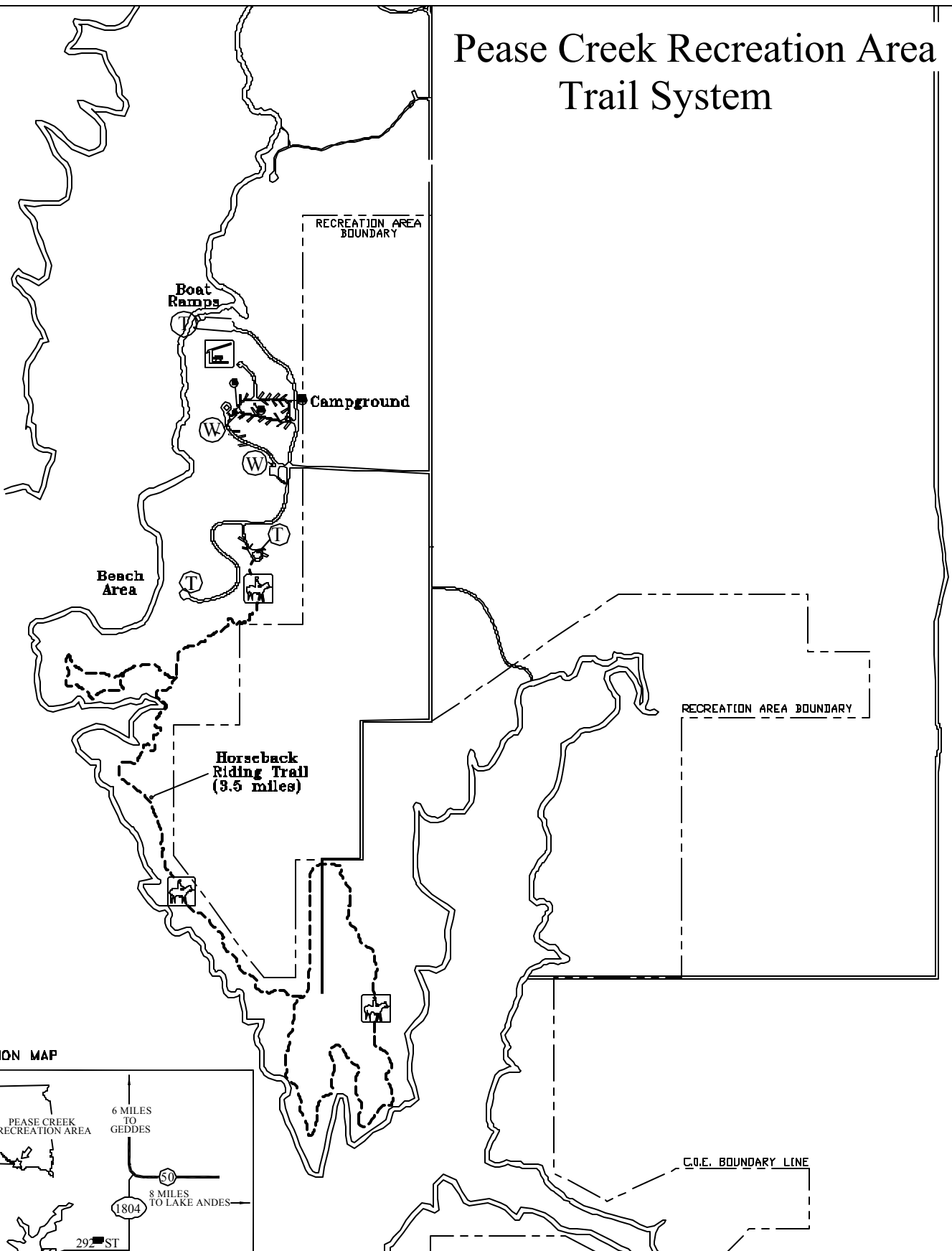
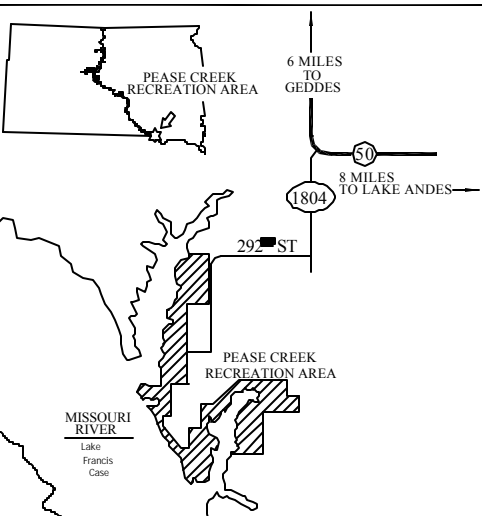


# Pease Creek Recreation Area Trail System

## Pease Creek Multi-Use Trail

**Type of trail:** Equestrian, hiking, biking, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing

**Trail surface:** Grass and Dirt

**Wheelchair accessible:** No

**Rated:** Moderate to difficult, mostly gentle rolling hills, but with several steep grades

**Fee required:** Park Entrance License

**Length of trail in miles:** Approximately four miles

**Location of the trailhead:** Day-use parking lot near self-registration station at entrance of park;  
equestrian camp trailhead is located in the equestrian campground, south end of park

**Facilities at or near the trailhead:** Day-use trailhead - Water, comfort station, vault toilet, campground;  
equestrian camp trailhead - vault toilet equestrian campground

**Facilities along the trail:** None

**Will there be interpretive information available:** Interpretive signs with trail maps at trailheads and at prominent intersections along trail

**What lodging opportunities are provided IN the park:** Electrical campsites (non-equestrian), non-electrical equestrian campsites

**Does this trail connect with any other trails:** No

**Nearest facilities for purchasing snacks, sunscreen etc.:** Geddes – 9 miles north;  
Lake Andes - 10 miles east

**Nearest motels/restaurants OUTSIDE the park:** Geddes – 9 miles north; Lake Andes - 10 miles east
